We are excited to announce the kick-off of our annual Design Build Competition!

Projects that deserve to be recognized and displayed for everyone to admire. So don't delay, send your entries into our Design Build competition for the chance to see that happen.

## COMPETITION DETAILS

- Buildings must be completed between November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 and November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017 by an authorized A&S builder.
- High-quality digital photographs must be submitted for each project. Please submit 2-4 high resolution (300 dpi) photos of your building. Blurry or low-resolution (72 dpi) images that can not be enlarged will be rejected.
- Up to 5 buildings can be entered per builder.
- A project submission form/photo publicity release form is required for each building entry (with signature!).
- Deadline for submissions are **December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017**.

## PHOTOGRAPHY TIPS

If possible, choose a nice, sunny day to take your pictures.

Take your time. Try multiple shots at different angles with close-up and distant shots. Clear area around building of debris and vehicles, if possible.

Use a good camera or consider using a professional photographer. This will make a difference in how your building is presented to the world.
